# NATIONWIDE SURVEY

INITIAL INSIGHTS

**NOVEMBER 2022** 

## **ABOUT**

Throughout October 2022 a nationwide survey on a Net-Zero New Zealand was held. The survey is a cornerstone element of the Net-Zero New Zealand Project which is turn generously supported by the Jeremy Bloomfield Scholarship at Te Herenga Waka- University of Wellington.

As part of the survey participants were asked for their views on climate change, New Zealand's Net-Zero Target as well as some key steps to take towards it. A range of demographic data was also collected to enable deeper stratification of the results in the next phase of analysis. Below are some initial insights as to participants' views.

## WHO TOOK PART?

Kiwis aged between 18+ were eligible to take part, whether they were based in New Zealand or offshore. 100+ participants took part.

Represented in the survey findings are the views of:

- Kiwis from all regions in New Zealand, including overseas
- Kiwis based in urban, semi-urban and rural settings
- Kiwis that identified as male, female and other
- Kiwis aged between 18-65+
- Kiwis from a range of ethnicities, including Māori & Pasifika



When asked how concerned they were about climate change participants said they were:



When asked the extent to which New Zealand should reduce our GHG emissions:

63.4% said a great deal 10.9% said not too much

16% said to some extent 7.5% said not at all

When asked how much is climate change currently affecting people in other countries:

62.4% said a great deal 9.9% said not too much

**22.8%** said to some extent 5% said not at all

When asked the degree to which climate change is currently affecting people in New Zealand:

17.8% said a great deal 17.8% said not too much

54.5% said to some extent 8.9% said not at all

1% said they didn't know

When asked the degree to which climate change is currently affecting people in their local area:

13.9% said a great deal 24.8% said not too much

46.5% said to some extent 13.9% said not at all

1% said they didn't know

When asked how seriously much they think climate change will them and their family:

40.6% said a great deal 8.9% said not too much

38.6% said to some extent 10.9% said not at all

1% said they didn't know

### ON A NET-ZERO NEW ZEALAND


When asked how familiar they were with Net-Zero:

Zealand target:


4.4% said very likely 16.3% said neither likely nor unlikely

When asked the extent to which they believed the way they lived their life was going to have to change to address climate change:

34.4% strongly agreed 6.5% disagreed

39.8% said to some extent 10.5% strongly disagreed

1.2% said they didn't know 5.4% neither agreed nor disagreed

When asked the extent to which they think that technology will help reduce most of our emissions:

3.2% strongly agreed 24.7% disagreed

39.8% agreed 21.5% strongly disagreed

1.2% said they didn't know 21.5% neither agreed nor disagreed
